#### **A. Total Number of Boxers to be Qualified:**

204 of the total of 286 places will be distributed through the continental qualifying tournaments. Two (2) boxers selected through Tripartite Commission (TC) Invitation places:

80 places have already been decided at the AIBA World Boxing Championship Chicago.

**D. Regulations for Continental Qualifying Tournaments:**

1. Participation in the 1st Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournaments will be restricted to boxers NOT having qualified for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games during the AIBA World Championships
2. Participation in the 2nd Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournaments will be restricted to boxers NOT having qualified for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games during the 1st Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournament
3. These dedicated Olympic Qualifying Tournament will be solely boxing events

**E. Two Tripartite Commission Invitation Places:**

Two (2) boxers selected through Tripartite Commission (TC)  
Invitation places:

1. Two (2) TC Invitation places will be made available for eligible nations
2. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests: (date to be confirmed)
3. The commission will confirm in writing a preliminary allocation of Invitation places to the NOCs
4. The allocation of remaining Invitation places will be confirmed to the NOCs by the (date to be confirmed)
5. Athletes granted Invitation places must have competed in the AIBA World Championships or in at least one of the Olympic Qualifying Tournaments

#### **F. Host Nation (China) Situation:**

1. According to the results in the Chicago World Championships, there were 7 Chinese boxers who directly qualified for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games by finishing within the top 8 (light fly, bantam, feather, welter, middle) or top 4 (heavy, super heavy).
2. As places are attributed to individual boxers, the athletes named in the attached sheet have qualified for the Games - the NOC cannot attribute the place to another boxer.
3. China therefore loses its 6 guaranteed places concept, which were created to ensure host nation presence in the competition **should Chinese athletes fail to qualify**; as stated in the AIBA Qualification System, *'for each place gained by a boxer from the host nation at the AIBA World Boxing Championships, the host nation will lose a guaranteed place'*. China has the same right as other NOCs to have 1 athlete per weight category, Therefore, the 7 qualified athletes have the right to participate in Beijing up to now.
4. In addition, China can still send athletes to the Asian Continental Qualifiers to try and qualify in the remaining events for which they have no qualified athletes (fly, light, light welter, light heavy), as long as the overall quota for Asia has not already been exceeded in a particular weight category.

#### **IV. Dates and Process of Confirmation of Places:**

- A. At the conclusion of each qualifying tournament, the names of athletes who have gained qualification places will be forwarded by AIBA to each athlete's NOC
- B. Following AIBA's notification of qualification places, NOCs must confirm their use of the qualified places to AIBA by the deadlines

**V. Reallocation of Unused Quota Position:**

1. If for any reason an NOC decides not to send to the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games a boxer having qualified during the AIBA World Championships, the place will be reallocated to the continent of this NOC for the 1st Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournament
2. If an NOC decides not to send a boxer having qualified during the 1st Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournament, the place will be reallocated to the continent of this NOC for the 2nd Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournament
3. If an NOC decides not to send a boxer having qualified during the 2nd Continental Olympic Qualifying Tournament or during the Oceania Continental Championships, the place will revert to the TC for reallocation

**VI. Additional Information:**

**A. Terms and Conditions of Each Qualifying Tournament:**

During the bidding process of selecting the Olympic Qualifying Tournaments, the host federations offered various different terms of conditions in terms of the coverage of expenses of participants. In this regard, each continental bureau needs to inform all federations in each continent the details.

**B. Selection of Referees and Judges for the Olympic Games:**

AIBA selects 10 Referees and Judges for the Olympic Games from the R&Js participated in the Chicago World Championships. The

remaining 21 R&Js will be selected through all 9 continental Olympic Qualifying Tournaments.

Therefore, AIBA strongly suggests to each federation to send its best R&Js for these Qualifying Tournaments. Certainly the federations can have its choice to send the same R&Js participated in the Chicago World Championships.

**C. Official Name of the Event:**

All host cities of the Qualifying Tournaments should use the proper name of the event as follow:

**“(1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup>) AIBA (Continent) Olympic Boxing Qualifying Tournament”**
